Into the Light was started here in Wichita. A guide leads visitors in small groups through different settings in absolute darkness. Through this experience, visitors learn how to interact without sight but by using their other senses, as well as experience what it is like to be blind. Andrew will give a presentation on how his guide dog assists him as a blind person. Following the presentation, he will demonstrate how to use the cane and his guide dog to find a chair and other items that others might think he would need help with accessing. People will see that disability does NOT mean lack of ability. The experience aims to change mindsets on disability and diversity, as well as increase tolerance for "otherness".
